



## DSS SPRINT SERIES

The following Sailing Instructions, in addition to those detailed in Section 1, are applicable to all competing in the Derwent Sailing Squadron Sprint Series.

### 1. SCHEDULE OF RACES

Date	Race day	Course
15 Oct '17	Day 1	Multiple Races
26 Nov '17	Day 2	Multiple Races
18 Mar '18	Day 3	Multiple Races

### 2. STARTING TIMES AND IDENTIFICATION PENNANTS

RACE BRIEFING ON LAWN AT DSS 1200hrs

Pennant	Race Time
SB20 Pennant	1 <sup>st</sup>
Subsequent races will be started as soon as possible after finishing previous race	

### 3. STARTING AND FINISHING LINE

A Committee Vessel flying the DSS burgee.

Races will start on a line between an orange staff or an orange flag on the Committee Vessel and a Yellow and Red Flagmark, the Finishing line will be between an orange staff or an orange flag on the Committee Vessel and a Black and White chequered Flagmark

- 3.1 A distance mark displaying a Green Flag mark may be laid approximately on the Starting line. Boats shall leave this mark on the same hand as the committee vessel while starting from the preparatory signal until clear of the starting line

### 4. STARTING INSTRUCTIONS

RRS 26 is amended to read

Warning Signal	Class & Course flags raised	3 minute
Preparatory signal	Blue Peter raised	2 minute
One minute	Blue Peter lowered	1 minute
Start	Class flag lowered	0 minute

### 5. RECALLS

For INDIVIDUAL RECALLS RRS 29.1 applies.

### 6. SHORTEN COURSE

The course may be shortened at the end of the first lap by the display of code flag S on the committee vessel. Boats shall sail through the gate marks (2s/2p) then through the finishing line. This changes RRS 32.2.

All marks rounded to Port except 2s is left to starboard

7. COURSES

8. MARKS

A Start to 1 →1a→ 2s/2p →1→1a →2s/2p →Finish

8.1 MARK 1& 1a; will be Yellow Inflatable buoys laid to windward of the starting line. If there is a change of course the new mark will be Black with a Pink Band, if the RO changes mark 1 mark 1a will be removed.

8.2 MARK 2S/2P; A pair of Orange Inflatable buoys laid approximately 100m in front of starting/finishing line as a gate mark

9. TIME LIMIT

The time limit for the last race of the day will be 1600. If the first yacht finishes before 1600 hours other yachts will be timed until 1615 hours. Yachts that have not then finished will be scored DNF. This changes RRS 35.

10. ALTERNATIVE PENALTIES

RRS 44.1 is amended in that only one turn, including one tack and one gybe is required.

11. RADIO INSTRUCTIONS

The race committee may announce start procedures and boats OCS on VHF Channel 10

12. SCORING

Each day will be a standalone event, with up to five races per day.

The Low Point Scoring System, Appendix A of the RRS shall apply except all races shall count for total points
