1. ORGANISING AUTHORITY

1.1. The Combined Clubs consisting of The Derwent Sailing Squadron Inc. (DSS), The Royal Yacht Club of Tasmania (RYCT) and The Bellerive Yacht Club Inc. (BYC).

2. RULES

- 2.1. Races will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) 2021-24.
- 2.2. Boats shall comply with the Australian Sailing (AS) Prescriptions to the RRS and IRC and AMS Rules.
- 2.3. Racing will be subject to Government imposed COVID-19 restrictions in place on any given race day.
- 2.4. RRS 55.2 is changed to allow the use of fixed or retractable spinnaker poles and bowsprits for the purpose of setting asymmetrical spinnakers.
- 2.5. General Rules as described in Section 1 of the 2021-22 Organising Clubs' fixture and sailing instruction booklet.
- 2.6. RRS 52 is modified:
 - i. to allow adjustment of movable ballast or canting keels on any boat and the use of stored power to do so; and
 - ii. to allow the use of stored power for sail handling and sail trimming on any boat.
- 2.7. RRS 63.1 and A5.1 are changed by adding the following to each "The Race Committee may apply penalties without a hearing to boats which infringe the sailing instructions relating to keeping clear of start and finish lines. Penalties shall be as specified in the sailing instructions."
- 2.8. Appendix T Arbitration of the RSS applies.
- 2.9. Boats shall comply with AS Special Regulations Part 1, Category 7 for Groups 1, 2, 3 & 4 except that a fitted VHF radio is mandatory (This amends Special Regulation 3.25.1(b)). Group 5 shall comply with Category 7 together with a VHF radio (this may be a hand-held unit).
- 2.10. The Organising Authority may amend any detail of this notice of race before 17:00 on the 25 May 2022.
- 2.11. The minimum number of adult crew to be on board is three (3) unless dispensation sought in writing from the Organising Authority is granted by the Race Committee before a race.

3. ELIGIBILITY

- 3.1. Entry is open to owners of boats on the register of the BYC, DSS or RYCT. Other entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Organising Authority from members of other clubs affiliated with Australian Sailing.
- 3.2. Crew Declaration.
 - 3.2.1. For each race a boat shall submit a COVID-19 Crew Declaration via TOPYACHT before its group race warning signal.
 - 3.2.2. The Crew Declaration shall confirm that the boat intends to race and shall include required details of persons on board as follows:
 - i. Name;
 - ii. Contact phone number;
 - iii. Australian Sailing Number in accordance with NoR 3.3; and
 - iv. Any other information which may be required to comply with government COVID 19 reporting requirements or regulations.

- 3.2.3. Boats that do not comply with NoR 3.2.1 and NoR 3.2.2 will be scored DSQ without a hearing for the relevant race. This changes A5.1 RRS (2021-24).
- 3.3. All crew members must comply with the AS Prescription to RRS 46 as amended by AS. From 1 January 2022, all participating crew members shall be a member of a club affiliated to Australian Sailing or a Sail Pass holder.
- 3.4. The Combined Club's Race Committee reserves the right to accept or reject any entry.
- 3.5. Boats wishing to enter IRC or AMS may be requested to provide a copy of their valid IRC and/or AMS Rating Certificate/s.
- 3.6. Competitors who join a series after one or more races have been run will be awarded a 'Late Entrant' score for each earlier race. The 'Late Entrant' score will be DNC score for the first (non-abandoned) race run after the competitor joins the series. Previously allocated DNC scores for other boats will not be altered. This score will also apply to boats that have entered a series (IRC, AMS) but have not provided the appropriate rating certificate.

4. ENTRY

- 4.1. Entries should be lodged via one of the organising club's websites by no later than 17:00 on Friday 27 May 2022. Late entries may be accepted after this time at the absolute discretion of the Combined Clubs Race Committee.
- 4.2. No entry will be deemed to have been accepted until approved by the Combined Clubs Race Committee.
- 4.3. No entry will be deemed to have been accepted until approved by the Combined Clubs Race Committee and until a self-assessed Australian Sailing (AS) Special Regulations Equipment Audit Form for the appropriate safety category has been lodged with the Race Office of one of the Combined Clubs.
- 4.4. Entry fees for each series

Series Entry \$80

• Each additional Handicap Group (IRC, AMS) \$40 each Individual Race Day Entry \$25

• Each additional Handicap Group (IRC, AMS) \$15 each

5. INSURANCE

5.1. All competing boats are required to have a current Certificate of Insurance for the period of the series including Third Party Liability and Public Liability Insurance of not less than AUS \$10,000,000 (ten million dollars) for any one incident.

7. GROUP ALLOCATION

- 7.1. Boats will be allocated to Groups by the Combined Clubs Race Committee using Time Correction Factors (TCF) based on the Performance Handicapping System (PHS). Boats may be allocated to a Group outside of these parameters at the discretion of the Combined Clubs Race Committee
- 7.2. The Race Committee will allocate boats according to size, known performance and TCF handicaps (where known). The composition of each division will be available from 16:00 on the Friday before the first race in the series.
- 7.3. Non-Spinnaker entrants will be allocated to a group best suited to their predicted PHS performance.

8. RACES

8.1. All Groups will have one race only on each race day.

9. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

9.1. Sailing Instructions will be available from the organising Clubs by no later than 12:00 on Thursday 19 May 2022, and placed on the organising Clubs' websites.

10. OFFICIAL NOTICE BOARD

10.1. The Series Official Notice Board for each race will be located on the Notice Board of the Club assigned to conduct the race. Copies of notices will be placed on the other Club Notice Boards as soon as practical before and following a race.

11. RACING AREA

11.1. The waters of the River Derwent.

12. COURSES

12.1. As described in the Sailing Instructions.

13. SCORING

- 13.1. Races shall be scored based on handicap or rating system
- 13.2. Minimum Number of Races:
 - 13.2.1. Three (3) races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
 - 13.2.2. SERIES SCORE: When fewer than six (6) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
 - 13.2.3. When six (6) races have been completed a boat's series score shall be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

14. PRIZES

- 14.1. Trophies will be awarded to the first boat in each Combined Clubs Winter Series group.
- 14.2. Additional trophies may be awarded but the organisers reserve the right to vary the number of trophies awarded based on the number of entries

Five entries 1st prize

Six to nine entries 1st and 2nd prizes

Ten or more entries 1st, 2nd and 3rd prizes

- 14.3. A minimum of five (5) entries is required to constitute a group.
- 14.4. Individual race day prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the race day host club.

15. CLUB PENNANTS

- 15.1. Boats will automatically qualify for entry into their home club's respective group Winter Pennants.
- 15.2. Each club will award a Winter Pennant based on the full series of the Combined Clubs Winter Series and subject to scoring as described in Combined Clubs Winter Series NoR 13.2.

16. SAFETY

- 16.1. Boats shall comply with AS Special Regulations Part 1, Category 7 together with a VHF radio (this may be a hand-held unit).
- 16.2. The attention of all persons taking part in the Combined Clubs Winter Series races is drawn to the requirement to be aware of the application of the Marine Safety (Misuse of Alcohol) Act, 2006.
- 16.3. Persons in charge are also reminded of the requirement for the wearing of lifejackets where full lifelines are not provided. AS Special Regulations Part 1, Section 5, 5.01.1 (j) shall apply.
- 16.4. For Sports boats, AS Special Regulations Part 1, Section 5, 5.01.1 (j) (Lifejackets) shall apply, and is recommended for all other boats without lifelines.
- 16.5. Boats will comply with the Combined Clubs "COVID-safe Environment Plan" which is available on all Clubs' websites.
- 16.6. It is also recommended that entrants have a Man Overboard procedure that all crew members have practiced.
- 16.7. Boats must report any serious on water incidents to the Race Officer/Race Committee as soon as practical (for example man overboard, collision, grounding or crew injury).
- 16.8. Attention is also drawn to the requirement for boats to keep well clear of vessels under pilotage especially vessels proceeding through the Tasman Bridge.

17. MEDIA RIGHTS

17.1. The owner or charterer of a competing boat and all crew members shall grant the Combined Clubs member Clubs the unconditional, perpetual right and authority to publish and broadcast anywhere in the world, for any purpose and in any medium, names, images, data of the crew and still and moving images of the boat and its crew prior to, during and after any Combined Clubs Race.

18. PRIVACY NOTICE

18.1. Personal information about crew members is obtained in the crew lists for use in case of emergency or COVID-19 contact tracing situations. If necessary, the information will be provided to Public Health Authorities, Emergency Organisations or the Water Police and may be passed on by them to other organisations as required. A condition of entry is that crew members are to be informed of this and advised that they may obtain access to the information held about them by contacting the Organising Authority.

19. LIABILITY DISCLAIMER

- 19.1. All persons taking part in all races, whether as entrants or otherwise, do so at their own risk and responsibility. Particular attention is drawn to RRS Fundamental Rule 4 Decision to Race.
- 19.2. The BYC, DSS and RYCT their executives, boards, servants and agents and all other parties involved with the conduct and organisation of the Summer Pennant Series disclaim any and every responsibility for loss, damage, injury, death or inconvenience that might occur to persons or property, both ashore and/or afloat, as a consequence of participation in the races covered by this notice of race and by the sailing instructions.
- 19.3. The Combined Clubs are not individually or collectively responsible for the seaworthiness of a boat whose entry is accepted or the sufficiency or adequacy of its equipment.
- 19.4. The Combined Clubs reserve the right to refuse or withdraw any entry.
